

Twin Lakes Canoeing and Hiking Lake Clark National Park

The canoeing and hiking tour around Twin Lakes in Lake Clark National Park offers a view of Alaska from its best. From icy volcanic peaks to open treeless tundra, the remote and very little visited National Park in south west Alaska offers a variety of ecosystems and wildlife. The tour offers relaxing base camps, day hiking and fishing for lake trout.

To start the trip we meet in Anchorage. A following flight will bring us across the Cook Inlet into the glaciated Chigmit Mountains, a part of the Aleutian Range. Our pilot drops us at the east end of the upper Lake, where we set up our first camp. We paddle for 6 days across the Twin Lakes towards the outlet and pick up point at the lower lake.

On our way to the lower lake we stop and visit the cabin of Dick Proenneke, the author of the best selling diary "One Man's Wilderness". He built this cabin in 1968 and lived there for 30 years.
